
Caterpillars Change


Number the pictures in order, from 1 through 4, to show how a caterpillar becomes a butterfly.












Learning Buddies: Trace and say the number. Read the questions. Touch and count to find the answers.

My Sentence Learning Buddies: Read the first part of the sentence aloud. Ask your child to think of a way to finish the sentence. Write your child's words in the lines. Read the entire sentence to your child while pointing out that reading is done from left to right. Older children may want to trace all or some of the letters in the sentence.







Sunday

Letter Identification

With your child, look through the newspaper to find pictures of things that start with the same sound the letter C makes in the word caterpillar.

Monday

Math Play

Point to the number 7 in the newspaper. Have your child say the number and, if it's large enough, have your child trace the number.

Tuesday

Caterpillar Crawl

Trace your finger around a page of the newspaper with a picture of at least one plant. Say, "Our little caterpillars are crawling all over looking for food." When you get to the picture of the plant pretend your caterpillar finger is eating!

Wednesday

ABC Caterpillar

Cut out 26 circles from colored construction paper. Glue one letter of the alphabet onto each circle. Once you have a letter on each circle, glue the 26 circles ogether, in ABC order, to make a long caterpillar.

Thursday

Life Cycle

Look through the newspaper for people in different stages of life. For example you might find pictures of a baby, a child, a teenager, a parent and a grandparent. Cut these out and have your child put them in order from youngest to oldest.

Friday

Signs of Spring

Look through the newspaper for pictures and artwork that are signs of spring. Then go for a walk and see if you can find these same signs of spring in your

Saturday

Play 'I Spy'

Look at a page of the newspaper with your child. Say, "I spy something that is (give a clue about what you are spying)." See if your child can discover "spying."
