
Newspaper reading adventures for little learners!



Letter Identification

With your child, look through the newspaper to find pictures of things that start with the same sound the letter B makes in the word bunny.

Monday

Math Play

Point to the number 4 in the newspaper. Have your child say the number and, if it's large enough, have your child trace the number.

Tuesday

Hop, Run, Swim and Fly

Look through the newspaper for pictures of animals. Talk about how each animal moves. Does it hop? Run? Swim? Fly? Or do all of these?

Wednesday

Egg Hunt

With Easter coming soon, the newspaper is full of pictures of Easter eggs. Have your child hunt through the paper and color all of the Easter eggs.

Thursday

Sort Easter Eggs

Hunt through the newspaper for more Easter eggs. Cut them out and sort them by size. Are there any other ways the eggs can be sorted?

Friday

On the

Bunny Trail Give your child some cotton balls and glue. Look through the newspaper together and glue a cottonball tail on each bunnies you find there.

Saturday

Bunny Hop

Lay 5-10 folded sheets of newspaper on the floor like stepping stones, with space between each paper. Play Follow the **Leader** as you hop over each of the papers.
