




Circle the picture that comes next.




## My Rhyme Time


**Learning Buddies:** Trace and say the number. Read the questions. Touch and count to find the answers.

### Sunday

#### Letter Identification

With your child, look through the newspaper to find pictures of things that start with the same sound the letter G makes in the word glove.

### Monday

#### Math Play

Point to the number 5 in the newspaper. Have your child say the number and, if it's large enough, have your child trace the number.

### Tuesday

#### Five Hands

Look through the newspaper to find and count 5 hands. Cut out the hands and make a 5 hand picture. Repeat with other parts of the body.

### Wednesday

#### Pattern Practice

Look at one page of the newspaper and circle an uppercase letter G, then circle a lowercase letter g. Repeat the process. Tell your child this is a pattern game and that your pattern is G g G g. Ask your child, "Which letter comes next?"

### Thursday

#### Sports Safety

With your child, point to and name the different clothing and sports gear each athlete is wearing in the sports section of the newspaper. Discuss how different clothing and gear keeps people safe while playing sports.

### Friday

#### Sporting Theater

With your child, take turns trying to hold the poses of people in pictures in the sports section of the newspaper.

### Saturday

#### Newspaper Chains

Use the newspaper to get practice cutting with scissors. Have your child cut the columns of ads into long strips. Roll up the strips to make links for a long newspaper chain. Newspaper chains make great Halloween decorations!
