Tuesday, July 20, 2010, at 1350 hours, I was dispatched to 280 South Homestead Street to serve Matthew and Genevieve Hainline an injunction against harassment in behalf of Alvera Black, and Rex Black.

I and Deputy Curtis Cooke arrived at 280 S Homestead, a shop that was located behind the Hainline's residence at 480 West Garden. We located Matthew Hainline in the shop area along with Shad Stubbs. Matthew had his blue Dodge pickup pulling a gooseneck trailer backed to the garage door of the shop, and it appeared they were in the process of removing Mrs. Black's property from the shop and loading it on the trailer.

I approached Mr. Hainline and asked him if his wife, Genevieve Stubbs was also at that location. He said no, she was at his house located at 480 W Garden. I informed Mr. Hainline there was an injunction prohibiting him from being at 280 South Homestead Street, and also a court order ordering him to remove any of his property from that address. I told him that both the injunction and the court order had been issued by Moccasin Justice Court and served him with both orders. Mr. Hainline said he did not believe the injunction was valid, and said he had talked to the court that morning, and was told by the court there would not be an injunction issued. He said the court told him a hearing was to be set up with both parties before an injunction was issued. I told Mr. Hainline the injunction had indeed been issued, along with a court order, ordering him to remove any of his property from the address of 280 S Homestead Street.

I and Deputy Cooke walked with Matthew Hainline to his residence at 480 W Garden Avenue, during which time, Mr. Hainline said he was going to call the court and verify the injunction. I informed him the injunction was valid, and I had now served it on him. When we arrived at Mr. Hainline's residence, Mr. Hainline went into the residence, closing the door. Deputy Cooke and I waited outside.

While waiting outside, myself and Deputy Cooke heard Mr. Hainline and Ms. Stubbs talking about the injunction. Ms. Stubbs said she needed to call Jethro Barlow to determine what was going on with the injunction. After a few moments, Mr. Hainline and Ms. Stubbs both came to the door and talked to myself and Deputy Cooke.

Ms. Stubbs told us she did not believe the injunction was valid. Mr. Hainline agreed with her, and again said he did not believe the injunction was valid because they had talked to Moccasin Court

earlier that day. Ms. Stubbs said she was going to call the Moccasin Court right then. I served Genevieve Stubbs the injunctions and the court order. I told Mr. Hainline and Ms. Stubbs that the court order was ordering them to return any items they had taken from 280 South Homestead shop. Mr. Hainline said they had not removed any items from that location, and did not know how he was going to be able to return anything if they had not taken anything from there.

I then read the court order to them, which said they were to remove any items they had placed on, or caused to be placed on the disputed property until a court of competent jurisdiction could determine right to possession.

Ms. Stubbs asked me who had signed the court order. I told her that Judge Kalauli had signed the order. She looked at the order, and said it was not Judge Kalauli's signature. I assured them that the order was valid, and my job was to serve them with the court order and the injunction which I had done.

Mr. Hainline said "When we find out these court orders are not valid, we are going to file charges against you bastards." Mr. Hainline and Ms. Stubbs then went into the residence and myself and Deputy Cooke left.

I returned to the Colorado City Marshal's Office and completed a declaration of service on the injunctions to Mr. Hainline and Ms. Stubbs, and the court order. I faxed the declarations of service to the court, notifying them that Mr. Hainline and Ms. Stubbs were served both the court order and the injunction. I also called Moccasin Court and talked to a court clerk. I told her Mr. Hainline and Ms. Stubbs had been served with the injunction in behalf of Mrs. Black. I asked her what the court felt was a reasonable amount of time to allow for Mr. Hainline and Ms. Stubbs to remove anything they had placed on the disputed property. The court clerk said on most protective orders one party was given approximately 20 to 30 minutes to gather their items, or to remove any items with the officers present. She said that would be a reasonable amount of time to give the Hainline's to remove their property. I also informed the Court Clerk that officers would be going back to 280 S Homestead, and would stand by while Mrs. Black returned the items Mr. Hainline and his associates had removed from the shop.

At 1425 hours, I again returned to 280 S. Homestead Street with Deputy Cooke. I observed that Mr. Hainline had not moved his truck or the gooseneck trailer from in front of the roll up door of the shop. His vehicle had not moved and was where it had been when I had served him the injunction and court order.

I talked to Mr. Hainline, and told him I noticed he had not removed his vehicle or property. Mr. Hainline said he had not moved it yet. I asked him how much time he needed to remove his property to comply with the court order. Mr. Hainline said, "as long as I want".

I told Mr. Hainline I would give him ten minutes to remove property and his vehicles from that location. Also present with Mr. Hainline in the shop were Shad Stubbs and Shawn Stubbs. I also told Mr. Hainline if he did not comply with the court order and remove his property from the location, I would arrest him and impound his vehicle. Mr. Hainline said I could not arrest him. I assured him I could arrest him if he did not remove his vehicle and property according to the court order. Mr. Hainline then told me to arrest him at that time. I declined and told him I would give him another ten minutes to remove his vehicles and property. Mr. Hainline attempted to argue whether the address the court had put on the injunction and the order was correct, claiming the shop address was the same as his residence address, off of Garden Avenue. He said there was no such address as 280 S Homestead. I told Mr. Hainline I was not going to argue with him. I was only going to give him another ten minutes to comply with the court order, as he had already been given 30 minutes. Mr. Hainline then told me if I arrested him, he would sue me.

Deputy Cooke and I went back to my vehicle, and contacted Marshal Jonathan Roundy, and informed him of the situation. I asked Dispatch to get me additional back up officers because it did not appear Mr. Hainline was going to comply with the court order.

Dispatch informed me that Mr. Hainline had called 911, and reported the Marshal's Office officers were trespassing on his property and asked to be transferred from the local dispatch to Mohave County Sheriff Dispatch and Dispatch had transferred his call.

Officers Hyrum Roundy, Sam Johnson, and Marshal Jonathan Roundy arrived at my location.

I showed Marshal Roundy the injunction and the court order, and told him it had been served at approximately 1400 hours. I told him Mr. Hainline had been given more than 30 minutes to comply with the court order, and had not done so, and did not appear to be willing to comply with the court order.

After approximately ten minutes, myself and Marshal Roundy walked into the yard, and met with Matthew Hainline, who was in front of his vehicle. Marshal Roundy explained to Matthew Hainline that he needed to remove his vehicles and property from the shop to comply with the court order. Mr. Hainline told us he had called Mohave County Sheriff and was not going to remove them until Mohave County Sheriff Deputies arrived at the location. Marshal Roundy then

told Mr. Hainline he was under arrest for refusing to comply with a court order, and asked him to put his hands behind his back. Mr. Hainline refused to put his hands behind his back. Marshal Roundy grabbed his right wrist and pulled it behind his back. Mr. Hainline attempted to twist away from Marshal Roundy. I drew my taser, and pointed it at Mr. Hainline. I told him if he did not put his hands behind his back I would tase him. Mr. Hainline complied and put his hands behind his back and Marshal Roundy placed him in handcuffs.

After Mr. Hainline was under arrest and placed in handcuffs, he called out to Shawn Stubbs and asked him to remove his vehicle from the property. He told us we could not remove him from the property until Mohave County Sheriff deputies arrived.

I took Mr. Hainline to my police vehicle and secured him. I told Officer Sam Johnson that Mr. Hainline was now under arrest, and that he should impound Mr. Hainline's vehicles that were still on the property. Mr. Hainline called to Shawn and Shad Stubbs and told them to lock his vehicles, and to not allow us to impound them. Marshal Roundy advised Shawn and Shad Stubbs they should not interfere with the Marshals Office deputies.

I searched Mr. Hainline incident to arrest with Deputy Curtis Cooke present. I emptied his pockets onto the back seat of my police vehicle. Mr. Hainline had a large amount of cash in his right front jeans pocket. After searching Mr. Hainline, I set him into the front passenger seat of my police vehicle. Mr. Hainline continued to argue that he was not on the disputed property, and Mohave County Sheriff's Office had told him to remain there on the scene until they could respond and we could not remove him. I told Mr. Hainline I would call the Moccasin Justice Court and ask if he could be taken directly to the court or if he should be booked into jail. I called the Moccasin Court and talked to the court clerk. She said the Judge was currently on the bench, and he had a full schedule. She said the Judge would recommend he be booked into jail and brought to court in the morning. Deputy Cooke counted out the cash and sealed it and the other items taken from Mr. Hainline's pockets and read Mr. Hainline his Miranda Rights. I and Deputy Cooke transported Mr. Hainline, to the Marshal's Office and completed a Mohave County booking packet. I issued Mr. Hainline a citation for interfering with a judicial proceeding.

I transported Mr. Hainline to the Washington County jail, located in Hurricane UT, where he was booked.

During the transport to the Washington County jail, Mr. Hainline overheard on the police radio that Ms. Stubbs was also arrested. He became very upset and insulted me and the Marshal's Office

by using profanities. I did not respond to him, feeling it would be argumentative.

After booking Mr. Hainline into Washington County Jail, I returned to Colorado City Marshal's Office and met with Marshal Roundy. He informed me Sam Johnson and Deputy Curtis Cooke were also transporting Ms. Stubbs to the Washington County Jail for violating the court order. He said the Marshals office had impounded Mr. Hainline's Dodge pickup and allowed Mr. Hainline's relatives to remove the goose neck trailer. Marshal Roundy said Andrew Chatwin was also at the address with his vehicle and he was allowed to remove his vehicle.

I contacted Mohave County Jail transport and arranged for Mohave County Sheriff's Office to transport Mr. Hainline to Moccasin County Justice Court the next morning.

## Supplemental Report Marshal Roundy

On July 20, 2010 Sergeant Barlow requested assistance at 280 South Homestead Street. I arrived at 14:35 hours and Sergeant Barlow informed me that he had previously served both Matthew and Genevive Hainline the Court Order.

I read through the Court Orders CV20100047 and CV20100048 that had been served on both Mathew and Genevive Hainline at 13.52 hours. The Court Order # CV20100047 stated: IT IS ORDERED that the Hainline's remove anything they placed in or on the disputed property or allowed to be placed in or on the disputed property until a Court of competent Jurisdiction can determine rights to possession.

Court Order CV20100048 stated: THE COURT HEREBY FINDS:  
NO CONTACT. defendant shall have no contact with Plaintiff except through attorneys, legal process, court hearings,

NO CONTACT. Defendant shall have no contact with Protected Person(s) except through attorneys, legal process, court hearings

THE COURT FURTHER ORDERS:

PROTECTED LOCATIONS. Defendant shall not go to or near the Plaintiff's or other Protected Person's:

Residence 285 SOUTH HOMESTEAD STREET, COLORADO CITY, AZ, 86021;

Workplace 280 SOUTH HOMESTEAD STREET, COLORADO CITY, AZ, 86021.

Sergeant Barlow informed me Matthew had refused to comply with the Court Order after being served. I with Sergeant Barlow walk over to where Matthew Hainline was to give him another opportunity to obey the order. I spoke with Mr. Hainline and requested he comply with the Court Order that Sergeant Barlow had explained to him. Matthew stated "I'm waiting for Mohave County." Matthew refused to recognize the order or comply with the order. I then arrested Mr. Hainline with the assistance of Sergeant Barlow. Matthew said, "Fine, I will be out tonight and I will be out here doing the same thing."

Dispatch gave me a phone number to call Mike Hoggard from Mohave County Sheriffs Office. I explained to Deputy Hoggard the Court Order and told him that Matthew had been arrested for failing to obey the Court Order. Deputy Hoggard said he had been called and told the Marshals Office was trespassing. Deputy Hoggard said he talked to Genevive and told her she would have to comply with the Court Order. I informed Deputy Hoggard that we would remain at the address until the removal of Hainline's property was completed as per the Court Order. Deputy Hoggard stated he would not be responding.

Matthew Hainline's Dodge truck had not been removed. Shawn and Shad Stubbs were also at the shop helping Matthew. I asked them if any of the property at the shop was Matthew's or Genevive Hairline's, and they informed me it was not. Shawn informed me that the trailer hooked up to Matthew Hainline's Dodge truck belonged to Lance Stubbs, and Lance didn't know anything about the Court Order or what Matthew Hainline was doing with his trailer. I told Shawn I needed proof of ownership on the trailer. A second truck was at the shop which belonged to Andrew Chatwin. Shad Stubbs called Andrew and Andrew asked Shad remove his truck.

At approximately 15:22 hours, an hour and a half after Genevive was served the Court Order, Genevive came walking towards the shop and Matthew Hainline's truck. When I saw her coming, I informed her to not go on the property. I explained, "Genevive don't go on the property the Court Order tells you not to; Genevive this is a Court Order for you to not be on this property - go off right now or you will be under arrest. I will arrest you if you do not get back off the property." After repeated request to have Genevive respond to the Court Order, I told Officer Sam

Johnson to arrest Genevive. A crowd of six or seven people had gathered and I secured the scene by encouraging Lance, Shawn and Shad Stubbs to stay back from the scene which they did. Andrew Chatwin also started walking toward the Officers and I told him to stay back.

While talking to Lance Stubbs about the trailer, and I heard Andrew Chatwin say, "I got it all on video. Bruce Wisan told me a civil law suit is happening right now and they're going to work on Judge Kalauli so he can not make any decisions in this area. That's what Bruce just told me. So things are going to change it's just going to take a little time." I then said to Andrew, "Bruce Wisan is going to make it so Judge Kalauli can't make any decisions?" Andrew then said, "They're working on it so he can not make any decisions out in this area."

The trailer hooked up to Matthew Hainline's truck came back to a Millcreek Organization. I informed Lance Stubbs that I could not let him take the trailer if it was not his. He stated he had receipts showing he had been paying for the trailer and could contact the owner by phone and I could talk to him. I talked to the owner of Millcreek Organization, Steve, and he informed me that he had receipts from Lance Stubbs that showed he had made payments on the trailer. Steve told me that Lance had paid the trailer off even though the loan is in Millcreeks name the title is being sent to Lance Stubbs in his name. Steve said he had a DBA as Minute Man Equipment Rentals which was what the receipts showed. Lance took the trailer, and Mr. Hainline's Dodge truck was removed by Streamline Automotive.

On July 20, 2010 at about 14:30 hours I was called to backup Sergeant Barlow at 280 South Homestead Street in Colorado City. Sergeant Barlow requested some assistance with an injunction order from Moccasin Consolidated Court.

Upon arrival at the 280 South address I observed Mr. Hainline had his pickup and a gooseneck trailer, along with Andrew Chatwin's pickup on the property.

I observed Mr. Hainline talking on the phone instead of moving his things, the truck and trailer. Sergeant Barlow and Marshal Roundy went to the front of the truck to talk to Mr. Hainline. Deputy Cooke and I went to the back of the trailer where Shawn and Shad Stubbs were. I asked them what they were doing there. Shawn said they were just here with Matt. When Marshal Roundy and Sergeant Barlow started to arrest Mr. Hainline, Shawn and Shad started towards them from behind the trailer. I told them to not interfere with them. Mr. Hainline hollered at Shawn telling him to lock his truck and to not let us impound it. Marshal Roundy also told them to not interfere.

Sergeant Barlow told me to impound the vehicles. Mr. Hainline hollered to Shawn telling him to move his truck. I told Shawn again to not interfere. Deputy Cooke left with Sergeant Barlow. Deputy Hyrum Roundy assisted me with the impounding the pickup. Genevive Stubbs, Matthew's wife came onto the disputed property. She tried to push past me to get in the truck as I was standing in the driver door area. When she could not push past me the second time she climbed in the back of the pickup and tried to get the back window open. When she could not open it she climbed on the top of the truck and was trying to climb down into the truck. She said she was not going to let us take the truck. Marshal Roundy then told me to arrest her. Genevive resisted arrest. I told her not to resist, but she did not stop. Deputy Roundy assisted me in arresting her.

After the arrest I inquired about the safety and welfare of her children. Genevive asked me to ask Shawn to stay at her house and watch her children. I relayed the message to Shawn.

Deputy Cooke and I transported Genevive to Purgatory Correctional Facility.

I booked Genevive on ARS code 13-2810.2 Interfering with Judicial Proceedings.

## Summary:

On the afternoon of July 20, 2010, I responded with Sergeant Helaman Barlow to serve an injunction against harassment. The order was served. We returned to the address under dispute to enforce the courts order and keep the peace. Two arrests were made.

## Narrative:

At approximately 13:45 Sergeant Barlow asked me to go with him to serve an injunction against harassment on Matthew Hainline and Genevive Stubbs. We arrived on scene at approximately 13:50.

As we arrived on the scene I saw a dark colored Dodge with a "gooseneck" trailer attached to it parked on the south side of a small building. The truck and trailer were backed up to the garage door on the building. Sergeant Barlow parked on the northwest side of the property and we walked toward the building. We walked around the north end of the building and approached it from the east. As we approached the open garage door I saw Matthew Hainline standing in the shop.

Sergeant Barlow approached Mr. Hainline and informed him that we were there to serve him an injunction and a court order. Sergeant Barlow handed Mr. Hainline the papers and asked if Genevive was there. Mr. Hainline said that he had just talked to the judge, and that the judge said he was just setting up a hearing.

Sergeant Barlow and I then walked up toward the house with Mr. Hainline. While we were walking to the house Mr. Hainline stated, "Well we'll call on this 'cause I don't believe you sons of a bitches for one second." Mr. Hainline said he had talked to the judge earlier and that the judge had said he was going to hear arguments before making any decisions.

When we arrived at the house, Mr. Hainline went inside. The door remained open slightly, and I could hear a conversation between Mr. Hainline and Genevive Stubbs. Mrs. Stubbs told her husband that Jethro Barlow had told them that the judge was not going to take any action without hearing both sides.

Mr. Hainline and Mrs. Stubbs came out of the house and told Sergeant Barlow and myself that they did not believe that the order was valid. Sergeant Barlow told them to give the court a call. Mr. Hainline and Mrs. Stubbs had a discussion with Sergeant Barlow about what the order said. They then questioned the signature on the order. Sergeant Barlow informed them that it was Judge Kalauli's signature.

Mr. Hainline then stated, "K, well, when we find out that these are bogus we will be pressing charges against you bastards." He told Mrs. Stubbs to get some other papers to compare them to. Sergeant Barlow and I left the scene and returned to the office.

While we were still at the office, Sergeant Barlow received a phone call from Alvera Black. After talking to her for a few minutes, Sergeant Barlow called the Moccasin Consolidated Court. After the phone call he informed me that the court had said that 30 minutes was the usual amount of time that was allowed for someone to remove their property when an injunction was served.

Sergeant Barlow and I returned to the address to make sure Mrs. Black was safe while putting her belongings back in the shop. We arrived back on the scene at approximately 14:30.

When we arrived I noticed the truck and trailer had not been moved from the place it was parked when we were on scene thirty minutes earlier. Sergeant Barlow and I approached the open garage door from the east side again. Matthew Hainline, Shad Stubbs, and Shawn Stubbs were near the back of the trailer.

Sergeant Barlow noted to Mr. Hainline that he had not yet moved his property. He asked him how much time he needed. Mr. Hainline stated, "As long as I want." Sergeant Barlow informed him that he had ten more minutes to remove himself and his property from the location.

Mr. Hainline said Sergeant Barlow could not arrest him. A short interchange about the authority to arrest Mr.

Hainline ensued. Mr. Hainline stated, "Then go for it. I don't give a shit!" Sergeant Barlow informed Mr. Hainline again that he had ten minutes to move off of the property or he would be arrested and his vehicles impounded. Mr. Hainline stated, "Try it! I will sue the fuck out of you guys!" Sergeant Barlow said, "K, ten minutes."

Sergeant Barlow called Dispatch for back-up. I called Deputy Hyrum Roundy and asked him to respond to the scene for backup. Deputy Samuel Johnson and Marshal Jonathan Roundy arrived on the scene shortly after I called Deputy Roundy.

Mr. Hainline had walked south in the yard toward his house. He stopped about half way through his yard and began to use his cell phone.

Deputy Johnson and I went to the shop to secure the scene while Sergeant Barlow and Marshal Roundy approached Mr. Hainline. Shawn and Shad Stubbs were sitting on the end of the trailer near the shop.

Sergeant Barlow arrested Mr. Hainline. I left the scene with Sergeant Barlow and Mr. Hainline.

I returned to the scene approximately 30 minutes later at Marshal Roundy's request to assist Deputy Johnson. I again left the scene with Deputy Johnson. Mrs. Genevive Stubbs had been arrested while I was not at the scene. Deputy Johnson and I transported Mrs. Stubbs to Purgatory Correctional Facility.

## Conclusion:

I assisted in serving some court orders on Matthew Hainline and Genevive Stubbs. The orders were violated by Mr. Hainline and Mrs. Stubbs. They were both arrested. I assisted in transporting Mrs. Stubbs to jail.
