Dear Mr. [REDACTED]:

I am writing to inform you that your son, [REDACTED], has been found responsible for violating the Bowling Green State University Code of Student Conduct. Specifically, [REDACTED] was found responsible for violating Code of Student Conduct section 6d1 which prohibit the following behavior:

- 6d Offenses Disrupting Order or Disregarding Health and Safety*
- (1) Use, possession or distribution of illegal drugs including the use of drug related paraphernalia.*


Given that any further drug violations, for which [REDACTED] may be found responsible, will result in suspension from Bowling Green State University, we believe parental notification is an important part of the sanction plan for this violation.

In 1998, the United States Congress amended the Family Educational Right to Privacy Act of 1974 to allow colleges and universities who receive federal funding to notify parents/guardians of dependent students when a student has been found responsible for violating university alcohol, drug, or weapons policies. This change was made because of the significant health and safety risks and consequences associated with underage alcohol consumption, drug use, and weapons possession. Bowling Green State University supports the concept that the student, his/her parents/guardians, and the University are engaged in a partnership in which each partner has the responsibility to promote a healthy and productive educational experience for the student.

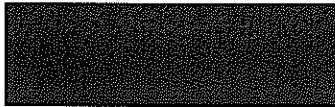

Dear [REDACTED]:

I am writing this letter as a follow-up to our meeting that took place on 4 October 2004. At that time we met to discuss allegations that you were in violation of the BGSU Code of Student Conduct. Specifically we discussed the allegation that you violated the following section of the Code of Student Conduct:

- 6 d. Offenses Disrupting Order or Disregarding Health and Safety.
 - 1) Use, possession or distribution of illegal drugs, including use or possession of drug paraphernalia containing illegal drug residue.

This charge stems from an incident reported by the Athletic Department on 21 September 2004 alleging that you had tested positive for marijuana use on 15 September 2004.

You accepted responsibility for this charge and chose to have your case handled by means of an informal disposition. Therefore, you waived your right to a formal hearing before the University Discipline Committee. As a result, the following sanctions have been imposed.

First, you are placed on University Probation through the end of the Spring 2005 semester. This probation becomes effective immediately and will end on the last day of the Spring 2005 semester. Should you interrupt your enrollment during this time frame, the probation will remain in effect until you have completed the probation period. While on probation you may continue taking classes and participating in any and all activities, however, you are not in good standing with the University. Any additional involvement on your part in violations of the Code of Student Conduct could result in suspension from the University.


Second, you must meet with Carrie Belair in the Wellness Connection in relation to the possession of illegal drugs charge. You must contact Ms. Belair for an appointment no later than 22 October 2004 and you must make and keep an appointment for no later than 5 November 2004. Appointments are made by calling 372-9355. There is a one-time \$100.00 administrative fee for the sessions with Ms. Belair that is due at the time of your first appointment (cash, check or bursar). It is expected that you will follow through on any and all recommendations that may result from this referral. Once the appointment is scheduled, you must attend.

Given that any further drug violations on your part will result in suspension from Bowling Green State University, parental notification of this matter will take place. It is the belief that parents and/or caregivers play a great role in the educational life of BGSU students, and your parents need to know that future violations on your part could jeopardize your ability to stay at Bowling Green State University.

You have the right to appeal the sanctions indicated above. Should you choose to exercise this right, a letter of appeal must be directed to Dr. Wanda Overland, Associate Vice President for Student Affairs and Dean of Students; no later than five days from the receipt of this letter. Dr. Overland will review your appeal and issue a final decision regarding the sanction. Dr. Overland's office address is 301 Bowen-Thompson Student Union.

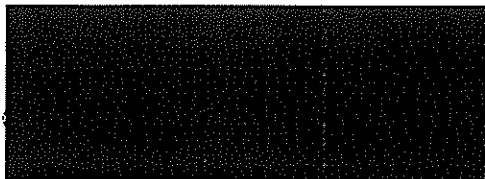

He has been suspended indefinitely from the Men's Soccer Program, his athletic aid for Spring 2005 has been removed, and he will be re-tested in approximately four weeks (the amount of time it takes for marijuana to clear your system). He is in violation of Athletic Department and University Policy. Therefore, I am now referring [REDACTED] to your office for further discipline. I have attached a copy of the positive drug test.
