There appears to be some confusion here on your Colorado Open Records Request, delivered to me by our custodian of records, Alice Clark, on Feb.

not on Feb. 27 -- which is the date I was given for your request.

Obviously, since this is all five days past, we cannot comply with your request if those parameters are correct.

I should tell you, however, that court rulings in Colorado make random drug

testing of our student-athletes illegal. We may test upon a suspicion based

upon evidence -- conduct or other information that a player might be using

drugs -- but random drug tests are not permitted and there is no revenue to support such tests.
