> Dear Mr. Carlisle:
>
> I have confirmed that there is no compilation of
> positive drug test
> results. That information is stored within
> individual medical records on a
> student-by-student basis. At this time, the
> Athletic Department's present
> method of storing that information meets its needs,
> and no new record will
> be created specifically to respond to your request.
>
> Regarding student medical records, let me clarify my
> position. I do not
> believe that medical records, with or without
> redactions, would not be
> subject to disclosure under Neb. Rev. Stat.
> 84-712.05(2). However, should
> you prevail in an appeal under the process that was
> included in my letter
> to you, you would be charged a fee equal to the cost
> of disclosing the
> records. The State Attorney General has defined that
> cost to include the
> labor associated with redacting the confidential
> information. If your
> appeal was successful, we would likely want to
> communicate further
> regarding the estimated cost of producing the
> records and the need for a
> deposit from you, which we are allowed to collect
> prior to fulfilling the
> request.

> For convenience sake, I have responded to your
> e-mail with an e-mail.
> Should you need or desire a hard copy response,
> please let me know, and I'd
> be glad to provide it. Thank you.

> Thank you for your letter of February 12, your
> prompt
> response to my request for records and the documents
> and information you provided.
>
> Before I determine whether to exercise my rights
> under
> Neb. Rev. Stat. 84-712.03, will you please affirm
> there has been no compilation of positive drug
> tests?
> It seems unusual to increase funding for drug
> testing
> without examining the number of positive tests
> either
> before or after the increase.
>
> If there is no compilation, will the university
> consider compiling the data? I agree the law does
> not
> require you to do so, however, the law also does not
> prohibit such work. And you noted in your letter
> there
> has been much national and public concern on the
> topic
> of performance enhancing drugs.
>
> If a compilation is not possible, I request you
> reconsider your position that "redactions do not
> adequately protect the confidential nature of those
> records."?
>
> Other universities and colleges have previously
> provided me with redacted documents that left me
> with
> no clue as to the identity of the individual in
> question. I believe the University of Nebraska can
> provide me with documentation and still provide
> protections to the subjects.
