Dear Mr. Carlisle:

This is in response to your follow-up request dated August 14, 2007, requesting a breakdown of positive drug tests by sport and detected substance.

The University declines to provide the information requested on the grounds that doing so under the circumstances of the drug test reports in question would make the identity of students easily traceable. The federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. Sec. 1232g) and its implementing regulations prohibit the disclosure of personally identifiable information about students without their consent. Personally identifiable information is defined to include a list of personal characteristics or other information that would make a student is identify easily traceable. 34 CFR Sec. 99.3. The New Mexico Inspection of Public Records Act exempts from release documents whose confidentiality is protected by FERPA. Section 14-2-1(A)(9), NMSA 1978.
