

# TEXAS TECH DEPARTMENT OF INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS ALCOHOL & DRUG POLICIES & PROGRAM 2006-2007

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**Please note: Coaches in each sport may have additional policies that are stricter than departmental policies cited herein.**

## **Alcohol Policy**

The consumption or possession of an alcoholic beverage, in violation of applicable law, on University property, or in the course of a University or student organization activity is prohibited.

Consumption of an alcoholic beverage within 48 hours prior to any intercollegiate athletic contest is prohibited.

Consumption or possession of an alcoholic beverage during an athletic road trip is prohibited.

Consumption or possession of an alcoholic beverage in the presence of a prospective-student-athlete during that individual's campus visit is prohibited.

Consumption of an alcoholic beverage by a student-athlete is prohibited where the student-athlete serves as a representative of the University at an official function.

The penalty for violating the Athletics Department Alcohol Policy will be at the discretion of each individual coach.

## **Drug Policy**

Drug use (excluding normal use of over-the-counter drugs such as aspirin and those drugs prescribed by a physician to treat a specific medical exemption) is detrimental to the student-athlete and is prohibited.

## **Program**

The Department of Intercollegiate Athletics at Texas Tech University firmly believes that the use of drugs (excluding normal use of over-the-counter drugs such as aspirin and those drugs prescribed by a physician to treat a specific medical condition) can be detrimental to the physical and mental well-being of its student-athletes, can seriously interfere with the performance of individuals as students and as athletes and can be extremely dangerous to the student-athlete and his/her teammates participating in athletic competition and practice. In light of these benefits and concerns, the Department has implemented drug and alcohol policies and a program to assist and benefit the student-athletes at Texas Tech University.

The Department of Intercollegiate Athletics at Texas Tech University is committed to a drug and alcohol program designed to assist student-athletes in meeting the demands of both academic and athletic pursuits. It is the Department's intent to help provide a safe and healthy environment for

student-athletes. To this end, a mandatory screening program has been implemented at Texas Tech University.

As a condition of participation in intercollegiate athletics at Texas Tech University, all student-athletes are required to sign a form stating they have read, understand and comply with the drug and alcohol policies and the consequences of any positive tests. This policy is reviewed with the student-athletes at the beginning of each fall semester or at such other time that a student-athlete commences his or her participation in intercollegiate athletics at Texas Tech University.

The basic goal of the drug and alcohol program is prevention of drug use and alcohol abuse, however, education and assistance with drug- or alcohol-related problems are key components of the program.

### **Goals of the Program**

1. To generally educate Texas Tech University student-athletes concerning the problems of drug use and alcohol abuse.
2. To educate any student-athlete identified with a problem regarding the use of drugs and/or alcohol as it may affect the athlete and his/her team and teammates.
3. to provide a common mechanism for the detection, sanction and treatment of specific cases of drug use and/or alcohol abuse.
4. To provide reasonable safeguards to insure that every student-athlete is medically fit to participate in athletic competition.
5. To prevent drug use and/or alcohol abuse by Texas tech University student-athletes.
6. To identify any student-athlete who may be using drugs and to identify the drug(s).
7. To encourage the prompt treatment of drug and/or alcohol dependency.

### **Implementation of Program**

At the beginning of the academic year, a presentation will be made to all intercollegiate athletic teams at Texas Tech University to outline and review the Department's alcohol and drug policies and program. A copy of these policies and program will be provided to each student-athlete. Each student-athlete will thereafter be asked to (1) sign a copy of the policy acknowledging receipt of a copy of this policy; (2) execute voluntary consent to the urinalysis testing required by the program; and (3) sign a statement authorizing the release of test results to a limited group of individuals.

Student-athletes and their parents/legal guardians are encouraged to ask questions or make suggestions at any time regarding this program. The Texas Tech University Department of Intercollegiate Athletics is committed to the success of this program and expects student-athletes to be equally committed.

### **Frequency of Testing**

To ensure fairness and efficiency of the testing program, testing notification will come from the Department's Drug Testing Coordinator. Tests will be administered on a random basis and may or may not be announced in advance. Tests may be administered at any time throughout the year. The Director of Athletics, the Associate Athletic Director for Compliance, and the Drug Testing Coordinator shall determine the number, timing and other procedures for testing. Further, a head coach may request a test be administered at any time he or she chooses.

Failure of the student-athlete to execute the consent form or submit an immediate drug test once they have been notified will be considered an automatic positive test, and all corresponding sanctions will apply.

### **Banned Drug List**

All student-athletes are subject to drug screening urinalysis to permit testing for any or all of the substances that appear on the NCAA list of banned drugs **The current list is located on the NCAA Web site ([www.ncaa.org](http://www.ncaa.org)) or may be obtained from the NCAA office. The list is subject to change and the student-athlete shall be held accountable for all banned drug classes on the current list.**

### **Testing Method**

The drug testing shall consist of the collection of a urine sample from the student-athlete under the supervision of a laboratory technician for the University Medical Center or such other agency, as the Department may deem appropriate. Each urine sample shall be analyzed for the presence of screened drugs. The testing agency shall report all test results to the Drug Testing Coordinator. A positive result shall mean a test result, which indicates, in the opinion of the outside agency performing such testing, the presence of one or more of the banned substances.

Appropriate precautions will be taken to assure and maintain the accuracy and confidentiality of the test results including the maintenance of a documented chain of specimen custody to insure the proper identification and integrity of the sample throughout the collection and testing process.

## **Sanctions For Positive Tests**

All student-athletes who test positive for substances listed on the NCAA banned drug list will be subject to, but not limited to, the following disciplinary actions including suspension and/or loss of scholarship during the period of the award. (Ed. Column 9/9/91 and NCAA Bylaw 15.3.4)

**Notification of Positive Test:** If a positive test is confirmed, the Drug Testing Coordinator will notify the Athletics Director and the Head Coach. Additionally, the Drug Testing Coordinator may notify the Associate Athletics Director for Compliance, the Sport Supervisor, the Sport Athletic Trainer, and/or the team Physician if deemed necessary. The head coach will be responsible for notifying the student-athlete.

**First Positive:** The student-athlete will be required to attend mandatory drug evaluation and counseling sessions arranged by the Drug Testing Coordinator. The student-athlete will be required to submit to additional retesting as deemed appropriate by the drug counselor. The drug counselor will determine the length of the counseling program. Refusal to participate completely in the counseling program, as set forth in this paragraph, will be treated and handled as a second positive.

**Second Positive:** If a second positive test is confirmed, the student-athlete will be subject to all of the sanctions of a first positive test. In addition, the student-athlete will be suspended from the next ten percent of regular season competition in accordance with the schedule for each sport found below:

Baseball	6 games	Football	1 game
Softball	6 games	Soccer	2 games
Basketball	3 games	Golf	2 dates of competition
Tennis	2 dates of competition	Track	3 dates of competition
Volleyball	3 dates of competition	Cross Country	1 date of competition

This schedule will be published annually for each sport.

**Third Positive:** If a third positive test is confirmed, the student-athlete will be immediately and permanently dismissed from athletic participation at Texas Tech University. If the student-athlete is receiving an athletic scholarship, it will be revoked at the end of the period of the award (i.e., the end of the current academic term or year).

## **Rehabilitation**

Rehabilitation is provided for those individuals for whom a possible drug problem exists through drug counseling program offered to all students at Texas Tech University. If an athlete is determined to be serious in chemical dependency, recovery hospitals, etc. will be at his/her own expense.

## Information and Self-Referral

The Texas Tech University Department of Intercollegiate Athletics encourages all athletes to inform themselves about drug use and to seek help about concerns. Any athlete who has a concern about drug use may notify the head athletic trainer that they have a problem and receive information, an assessment, and/or drug counseling. If a student-athlete so presents him or herself under this option and is using drugs, this may not count as a positive urine test result only on a one-time basis (subject to review). To avoid this being counted as a positive test result, the head athletic trainer must be approached prior to the athlete being notified that they are scheduled for a urine test.

## Nutritional Supplements/Ergogenic Aids Policy

The Department of Intercollegiate Athletics at Texas Tech University does not condone the use of supplements, ergogenic aids, creatine powder, amino acids, etc. Supplements and other ergogenic aids do not undergo the same quality control as do prescription and over-the-counter medications. These are considered food supplements and do not require the same strict control as medications. The claims that are made have not been based on scientific evidence in most cases, and many of these substances have had no research performed to substantiate their claims. The potential adverse and/or harmful effects of these substances have not been studied, but serious adverse effects have been reported in some instances. These substances are sometimes mislabeled and there have been instances of substances not listed on the label being contained in the product. It is truly a "*BUYER BEWARE*" market. It is important for you to remember that ***YOU WILL BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR EACH AND EVERY SUBSTANCE THAT ENTERS YOUR BODY.***

Texas Tech University, its agents, servants, trustees and employees disclaim liability and will not be held liable for any detrimental and possibly permanent defects caused by past, present and/or future use of nutritional supplements and/or ergogenic aids in any form by student-athletes.

## Tobacco Policy

The Department of Intercollegiate Athletics at Texas Tech University does not condone the use of tobacco in any form, including smoking and smokeless (i.e., "dipping", "chewing", etc.). Research has shown that the use of tobacco can lead to lung cancer, oral cancer, leukoplakia, emphysema, heart disease, heart attacks, etc. Texas Tech University, its agents, servants, trustees, and employees disclaim liability and will not be held liable for any detrimental and possibly permanent defects caused by past, present, and/or future use of tobacco products of any kind.

In accordance with Big 12 Conference policy and NCAA Bylaw 11.1.5, Texas Tech prohibits the use of tobacco products in and around all practice, competition, strength and conditioning sessions, meeting, film, locker room and travel areas. The Department of Intercollegiate athletics reserves the privilege to exercise any of the following options on a student-athlete found using and/or possession of any tobacco products in the aforementioned areas:

1. Verbal warning;
2. Suspension from activity for that day;
3. Suspension from a number of events;
4. Suspension for entire season;
5. Reduction or elimination of scholarship; or
6. Released from membership on the team.

By signing Texas Tech University's Consent and authorization Agreement, the student-athlete:

1. Acknowledges that he/she understands that they are to list all supplements on the Chain of Custody Forms at the time of any drug test;
2. Acknowledges the aforementioned policies and statements, and fully accepts the detrimental and possibly permanent defects caused by the use of supplements/ergogenic aids;
3. Fully accepts that they have been made aware of Texas Tech University, Big 12 Conference and NCAA policies with regards to the use of supplements/ergogenic aids;
4. Accepts any liability if they have in the past used, continue to use, or use at anytime in the future, supplements/ergogenic aids in any form;
5. Releases Texas Tech University and all personnel of any and all responsibility and liability;
6. Acknowledges the aforementioned policies and statements with regards to the use of tobacco products and fully accepts the detrimental and possibly permanent defects caused by the use of tobacco products in any form;
7. Fully accepts that they have been made aware of Texas Tech University, Big 12 Conference and NCAA policies with regards to the use of tobacco products;
8. Accepts any and all liability if they have in the past used, continue to use, or use at anytime in the future, tobacco in any form; and
9. Releases Texas Tech University and all personnel of any and all responsibility and liability.
