15 positive tests for THC (Marijuana), the sport breakdown as follows:  
1 Cheerleader, 7 Football, 1 Women's Soccer, 3 Men's Swimming, 1 Wrestling, 2 Men's Basketball

1 positive test for Cocaine:  
Men's Swimming (both THC and Cocaine discovered in the same student-athlete sample and considered one positive)

1 positive test for adderall (Ritalin):  
Football

1 positive test for alcohol (the student-athlete was under 21 years of age):  
Women's Basketball

2 failure to report (which were deemed an automatic positive):  
1 Cheerleader, 1 Men's Swimming
